## Title I, Part A Nonpublic Participation for Eligible Students that Live Outside the District Boundaries

Example: Calculating Title I Funding for Students Attending a Nonpublic School

During the fall consultation between the public school district and nonpublic school officials it is determined that the nonpublic school within the district boundaries has academically eligible nonpublic students residing outside the district boundaries. The public school district official requests the nonpublic school provide the home address of the eligible nonpublic student.

The district official should contact the public school district officials where these students reside to determine if these students reside within a Title I school boundary area. It is the responsibility of the district where the student resides to provide services to the student but the district of residence may arrange to have services provided by another district and reimburse that district.

## Illustration:

- During the fall consultation Middletown District has a nonpublic school within its geographic area that has 17 eligible Title I students.
- Middletown District obtains the addresses of the eligible students to determine if those students reside within district boundaries and would attend a Title I school. The district official asks the nonpublic school official to provide the addresses for the eligible students.
- Middletown District contacts Lakeland District & Centerville District officials to determine if those students that live outside Middletown District boundaries reside within the boundaries of a Title I school in their districts. The research shows:
  - There are 7 eligible students that live outside of Middletown District boundaries, in Lakeland and Centerville Districts.
  - There are 10 eligible students who reside within the boundaries of a Title I school in Middletown District.
- The district where the child resides is responsible for providing services to the child, but the home district may arrange to have services provided by another district and reimburse that district.

• If the home district of the eligible student determines to have the district where the nonpublic is locate to provide Title I services it pays the public school district the per-pupil funding unit (PPFU) of the Title I school where the nonpublic student resides for Title I services rendered.
